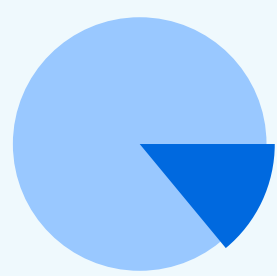


6 Stats to Encourage Mentorship, Collaboration, and Innovation at Education Events

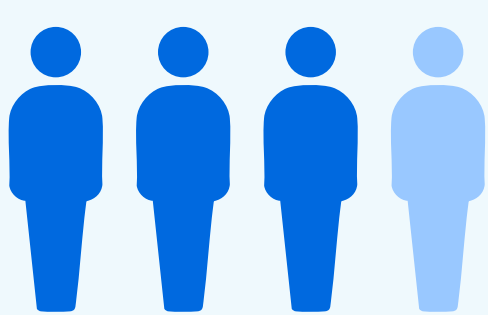

Only 14% of all U.S. public school teachers were under the age of 30 as of just a few years ago

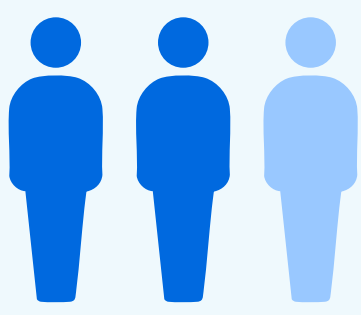

parents agree that teachers should be trusted to make decisions about classroom curriculum

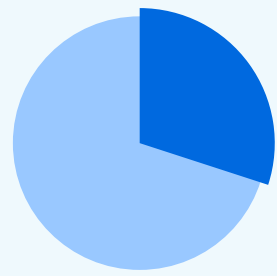
Most parents do trust teachers. Your education events' agendas should provide the tools and training these trusted education professionals need to be confident classroom leaders.

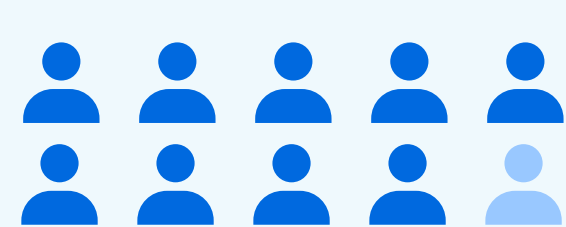
Up to 30% fewer people are going into teaching than were a decade ago

professionals list hosting successful events, conferences, and/or tradeshows as their top priorities.

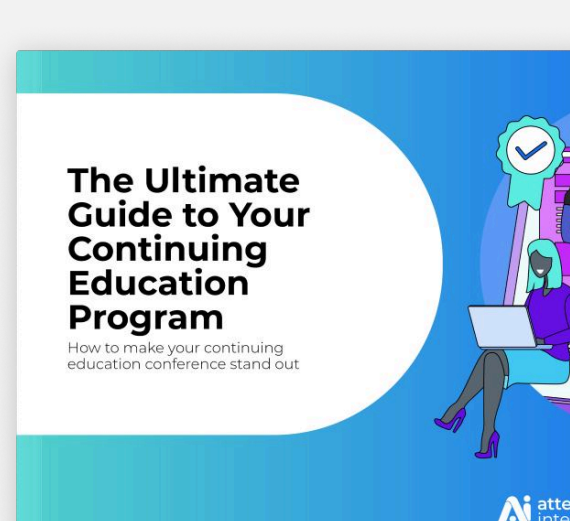
